Overview

Halifax Stanfield is a core component of the Atlantic Gateway, connecting Atlantic Canada to the world via air transport. Halifax Stanfield is operated, managed and developed by Halifax International Airport Authority (HIAA), a non-share capital corporation that invests airport revenues directly back into airport operations and capital investments.

The five-year strategic plan, covering the period from 2017-2021, is designed to provide a blueprint for HIAA to achieve its vision for the airport. The mission and vision statements of HIAA as well as our core values which guide us in our decisions, actions and behaviours were affirmed as follows:
